

School Meal Prices

Unfortunately we have had to take the difficult decision to raise the School Meal Price in September. As you are aware the cost of living continues to rise rapidly at present and as you might expect the associated costs of meals are doing the same. We are committed to trying to support you all where we can but the cost of providing a hot school meal has risen to £2.69 and we will need to pass this increase on to parents from September. Meals remain free for all children in Reception and Years 1 and 2.

Please don't forget you may be entitled to free school meals and I would strongly encourage parents to apply for these if they are entitled to do so. More information is available below and if you would like any support in doing this please contact the office. If your child gets a free meal anyway (in Reception, Years 1 and 2) please also apply for free meals.

For every child who is entitled to and applies for free school meals, our school funding is increased. Like everywhere budgets are tight, so if we are entitled to claim additional Government funding because of this we would like to claim it to support our children. *Please help us to do that*.

How to Apply for Free School Meals

It is now easier for parents to apply for free school meals. The new application process means that all applications are made electronically. In just a few simple steps and a matter of minutes you will receive an instant decision on whether your application has been successful.

Please do consider this as a gift option - the look on the teachers' and children's faces when they receive a pile of sparkling new books is wonderful!






Bikes and Scooters

NYCC's school meals service has come second in the national Green School Meal League. BBC Look North were in school this week to film a feature about it in the school canteen.






Some of our children were interviewed about what they enjoy about our school meals and the variety on the menu.

Get inventive with the Summer Reading Challenge 2022!



Children can once again sign up for the Summer Reading Challenge at their local library during the holidays. This year the theme is Gadgeteers and is all about getting creative with science and inventions.

The challenge for children is to read 6 library books of their choice and collect

special stickers and other prizes along the way – everyone who finishes will receive a limited edition Gadgeteers medal and a certificate. Any child aged 4 to 11 can join in and the challenge runs from Sat 16th July until Sat 10th Sept.

There will also be a fantastic programme of activities in libraries all summer, many of them free, to go with the challenge – flyers with more details will be sent to school for children to bring home

Covid Cases

We are seeing an increasing number of Covid cases within school.

The main symptoms of COVID-19 are a recent onset of any of the following:

- a high temperature or shivering (chills) a high temperature means you feel hot to touch on your chest or back (you do not need to measure your temperature
- a new, continuous cough this means coughing a lot for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours
- a loss or change to your sense of smell or taste
- shortness of breath
- feeling tired or exhausted
- an aching body
- a headache
- a sore throat
- a blocked or runny nose
- loss of appetite
- diarrhoea
- feeling sick or being sick

The DfE guidance for schools is as follows:

If you choose to use a covid test

If your child tests positive they may return to school after 3 days as long as they do not have a temperature. For adults this is now 5 days.

If you do not choose to test

If your child has one of the main covid symptoms listed above together with a high temperature they should should not return to school until they are well and have no temperature.

You are advised to carefully follow the general guidance Coronavirus: how to stay safe and help prevent the spread - GOV.UK (www.gov.uk) to limit the risk of further spread of COVID-19.

Recycling

Did you know that anything with a plug, battery or cable can be recycled? If you have a small electrical appliance like a hairdryer, iron, kettle or toaster that doesn't work anymore and can't be repaired, you can take it to your local Household Waste Recycling Centre. Even very small items like electric toothbrushes, torches, and razors can be recycled. Battery powered items like calculators and toys too.



UK households are hiding an astonishing 527 million unwanted electricals. If all these items were recycled, it would cut as much CO2 as taking 1.3 million cars off the road!



Inside electrical items are precious materials like gold, copper, steel and aluminium. If these items are binned rather than recycled, that potential to reuse those resources is lost forever.

When you recycle waste electricals, recovered plastic and metals can be used to make new products – from bicycles and children's play areas to life-saving equipment.

As well as being able to take items to your local Household Waste Recycling Centre, you can also drop off your broken and unwanted small electricals at 20 participating libraries until 8 July. More at www.northyorks.gov.uk/SmallElectricals
